Our Physical 'Infrastructure' vs the 'Emotional Roads' of 24 Million Aussies.

\$5.5 <u>Billion</u> / Year on Infrastructure - \$41 <u>Million</u> / Year on *beyondblue*This is less the one percent of infrastructure expense amount (see P3 for basic calculations)...
with 1,193 Road Fatalities but 2,522 Suicides - 1,329 more in 2013.

### Commonwealth/State Funding for beyondblue, 2014/15.

**P2** of this download is from the *Consolidated Financial Statements* for **Australia's Peak body for Suicide Prevention** *beyondblue*, for the year ended 30 June 2015, which tells us...

- The Commonwealth, States and Territories contributed \$41 Million to beyondblue
- This was approx **78% of beyondblue total revenue** for this financial year.

### Federal Funding for Infrastructure 2007-2014.

**P3** is from Australian Parliamentary website which gives the <u>'Estimated Actual'</u> Federal expentiture on infrastructure across Australia from 2007-2014, which tells us...

In these 7 years a total of \$38,379 Million was spent or an average of \$5,482 Million/year

• \$5.5 Billion/year. (Approx)

Road Fatalities vs Suicides 1980-2013. (See detailed graph in 'Stats' menu bar)

During this 33 year period Road Fatalities have gone from  $\frac{22.27}{100,000}$  of population in 1980 to  $\frac{5.16}{100,000}$  in 2013, a reduction of  $\frac{77\%}{100,000}$ .

While Suicides were **10.9**/100,000 in 1980, and were **10.9**/100,000 in 2013.

In ACTUAL deaths, this means suicides are currently **DOUBLE road fatalities**.

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In 2014 the then CEO of beyondblue, Ms Kate Carnell said the following...

\*"beyondblue CEO Kate Carnell AO has expressed her deepest concerns after Australian Bureau of Statistics figures released today show suicide was the leading cause of death for Australians aged between 15 and 44 in 2012. The figures, which are preliminary, show 2,535 deaths have so far been recorded as suicide in 2012. This is equivalent to around seven per day or 37 men and 12 women each week, making suicide the 14th most common cause of death in the country.

Ms Carnell said the figures represent a National Tragedy and should act as a call to action for all Australians to tackle the issue of suicide."\* beyondblue media release 25.3.14.

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I wonder if there is any Politician in Australia who is able to tell their electors, <u>and elector's children</u> - why it is - that they think this situation may have developed?

## Infrastructure expenditure

### Budget Review 2014-15 Index

The Treasurer announced in his Budget Speech 'a package of measures that will significantly increase investment in infrastructure across Australia'.[1] The infrastructure expenditure in the Budget for the years 2014–15 to 2017–18 totals \$28.5 billion. [2] The Budget also estimates that actual expenditure on infrastructure in 2013–14 will total \$6.9 billion, almost \$2 billion more than what is allocated in the 2013–14 Budget (\$5.0 billion).[3] New infrastructure expenditure increases so that in 2016–17, the last year of the 2013–14 Budget forward estimates, an additional \$5.1 billion has been allocated. This expenditure is shown in the chart and table below.
